#### **Northern Gulf: Kuwait – Ras Al Zour – Metrological Tower Collapsed.**

BA Charts: 1223, 3773.

Metrological tower reported Collapsed on position 28-46.000N, 048-26.100E, it is visible above lowest water and become an obstruction which might cause a navigational hazard.

Pole of 3.2 meters height with a white quick flashing light has been installed temporary on the remains of the damaged tower with total height of the light 6 meters above lowest low tide.

Mariners are requested to navigate with extreme cation while transit in the area.
